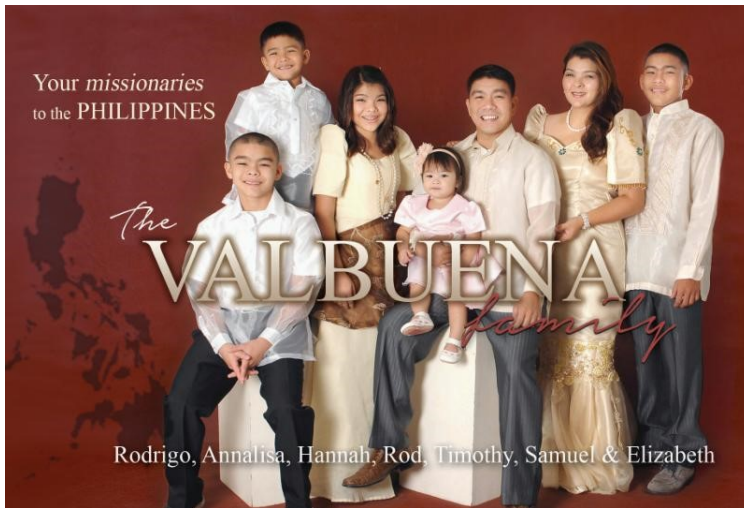


Operation Dorcas

Dear Friends,

Greetings from the Philippines! After much delay, due to the current pandemic, we made it safely home. We have been under home quarantine and strict monitoring by our local authorities for a week now and have another week left.

If you have ever been to the Philippines you will understand poverty. We do not live in a gated subdivision here in the Philippines but in a location where poverty is all around us. The Philippines has been in lock down for the past month and lock down here means if you are caught out you will be imprisoned or brought to the public plaza where you will be humiliated in which ever way the authorities see fit. Others have been made to make imaginary tiktok videos (where there is no cell phone) or twirl thier fingers as if playing with a cell phone for six hours while being laughed at. There have been cases which you may have even seen on the news where others have been shot to death. Prior to the lock down people around us would go out to find any odd job to do to bring something home to their families to eat but since the lock down they are not allowed out and therefore have no food at all. The government initially promised to give them food but in our barrio I have learned that the people have only once received 2 kilos of rice since the lock down and not everyone was given rice. The ones who were fortunate enough were those who live

near the main road.

Odek and I are so blessed to always have food to eat but it is heartbreaking to know that all around us people are starving. This week we will be working on repacking bags of rice, a kilo of hot-dogs and a tray of eggs to give to people around us. We have the ability to help 75 people but there are many more that need help.

I thought I would bring this before you and ask you to pray and see if you feel led to help us add more to the list of people we plan to help. Below is a breakdown of the expense:
A sack of Rice (50 Kilos) which can be divided among 25 people cost \$50.00
A kilo of hotdog for each person is \$3.00
A tray of eggs is \$4.00

I am excited to see the Lord work and for the opportunity to share God's love in a tangible way to people around us who feel that no one careth for their soul!
