## WORLD MISSIONS UPDATE FOR 21 MARCH 2021

### TIM & DIVINE LIBEREK (BELGIUM)

1. During the pandemic lockdown, Tim and Divine have tried to find creative ways to do outreach. Normally, they would invite neighbors to the church for a meal and then share the Gospel with them. This year, since they could not have neighbors eat at their facility, they baked thousands of cookies, put them in 165 bags with a gospel tract in them, and then distributed them to their neighbors. The neighbors were very touched by the caring jester.
2. After a food bank distribution last week, a man who Tim have had many conversation came up to him and blurted out, "I am really fascinated by your Jesus." For the first time, the man grasped the concept that only Jesus is qualified to pay for our sins since he is sinless. Alex then asked if Tim's God was accept his gods. Tim told him that he had to make a choice between accepting the one true God and following his gods. Alex replied, "Let's pick this conversation up next time."
3. After counseling a man last week, Tim encouraged him to give everything over to Jesus. As the man was leaving he exclaimed, "My life will never be the same."
4. Divine is busy with Yaël, but her ministries with the children and women has been greatly curtailed due to the pandemic. However, Divine has been able to concentrate more on her music vocals and leading music.

### KENT AND SUSAN HIRSCHELMAN (SEED COMPANY)

1. The Dolisie Cluster translation project in Brazzaville, Congo is to teach story tellers to share 29 stories of the Bible reliably in 6 different languages. They began with the stories of Jesus healing a woman with an issue of blood & Jesus raising a little girl from the dead. They practice in churches, courtyards, in the neighborhoods, & over the phone. At the end of 2 weeks, 30 narrators had shared the Bible stores to 1500 people, many of whom had never heard any portion of the Bible spoken in their language.
2. Kent is able to start traveling again after the lockdown.
3. Suzanne will have knee surgery on April 6<sup>th</sup> for a torn meniscus. She will not be able to put any weight on her leg for 8 weeks. Also, her back hurts so bad that she is in a great deal of pain when she

uses her walker.

### MATT & ELIZABETH VAN WART (UGANDA)

1. During the lockdown, both Matt and Elizabeth have stayed busy delivering medicines, bake goods, and food to the neighbors. They put together packages of sweets and toys for children who were in the hospital over Christmas, and their children helped them deliver the gifts.
2. Elizabeth was involved in a craft fair where they raised enough money to buy 16 new chairs for the church.
3. They visited the Bible College in Kiburara and fellowshipped with the teachers and workers there. At the college they learned how to harvest hibiscus to make tea.
4. Lately, the children at Elizabeth's Sunday School class have been asking her to read to them after class. This is a great way to stimulate learning. Eliz. also enjoys rummaging through the clothes at the clothing market, where the clothes are in piles.
5. Matt is rebuilding the trailer that rusted away & extending its top.
6. They also hosted a Valentine's Day luncheon. Eliz. made 3 gallons of spaghetti sauce & 150 iced cookies
7. They are still helping other missionary families pack up as they leave the field for various reasons. The missionary community is shrinking & needs to be bolstered.
