## ***WAYNE & SUE ROYCE – ABWE – Cape Town, South Africa***

### Prayer Requests:

Wayne had an accident 10 days ago where he was cutting steel and he cut his big toe. It ended up fracturing the toe and leaving metal inside. We took him to the emergency room but they could not fix it there. So Wayne was admitted and had surgery on his big toe. He now wears a large boot and has to elevate it regularly. As our son Josh said, "This is really gonna slow him down." He sees the doctor again on Wednesday. Please pray for healing.

Visa Situation - There is nothing new to report on our visas. They are still expired and we are waiting for our renewals. However, since we are coming to the States for June and July, when we return they will give us 90 day visas to stay in South Africa. This means we will have three months to receive our new visas. We are not alone in this. It is happening to most ABWE missionaries here in South Africa.

We are experiencing severe load shedding here in South Africa. We are averaging 8-10 hours a day with no electricity. Thankfully, we do have a woodstove for heat, a gas stove for cooking and a battery pack inverter that we are able to take from church to church and have power for services. Winter is coming and this will be so very hard on all of our people. It also really effects Simanyene Center and the Residential Home each day.
