Merry Christmas and greetings from Uganda! We have had an eventful couple of months and we are excited to share some of what's been going on.

First of all, I'm happy to report that the group in Kiburara (pictured above) has completed the first round of trainings to become trainers in Community Health Evangelism. To celebrate this milestone, Elizabeth baked a cake and we had a party. The next step for them is to complete a project in their community to kick off their CHE program. They put together a plan for their project and we got together to review it. They started off with some pretty lofty goals. They wanted to organize the community members to have a trash pick-up in the main trading center. Along the way they ran into some road blocks--some of the local leaders had promised that they would get the word out, but they didn't. In spite of the setbacks they didn't let themselves get discouraged, so we got together again last week and they had revised the plan and are going about putting it into action in the smaller trading center closer to home. I encouraged them in some strategic ways to prevent a second disappointment. The project is set for the 16th of December, and the men are doing a great job organizing and preparing. Please be praying that it goes well and the guys keep their current excitement for the project.

Something fun we did as a family recently was take a trip to the coast of Kenya for our East Africa Spiritual Life Conference. Every few years our mission puts together a retreat so the missionaries can get together. It's refreshing to connect with folks from other places, hear their stories, and be blessed with good teaching. There was a pool, the ocean, good food, and air conditioning! It was such a blessing. On the way to and from, we stopped in Nairobi and got to do some thrift store shopping. It was great to get away as a family for a bit.

Liz and the kids are still plugging away at school. We are so thankful for the answer to prayer that FICA is there for the kids to have a way to connect with other kids their age. That reminds me--we invited all the students from their class over last weekend for a Christmas party before the school break. It was a great time for everyone.

Other things going on...

The Bible college in Kiburara had its graduation 2 weeks ago. (Please be praying for the recruitment process as the next class will begin in February.)

We have had some great opportunities for hosting, and we have 'bookings' filling up into the new year.

In the week before Christmas, we will be kicking off a Community Health Evangelism training with some teachers of a local Bible School located in the nearby town of Ntungamo. I feel like this will be another great partnership where we can be a help and encouragement to God's ministers here. Please pray that the training will go well and that Liz will enjoy hosting 6 men for 3 meals a day while preparing for Christmas.

Our church Sunday school party and Christmas program are scheduled for this next weekend. Liz is in charge of decorating, games, and cake at the party and herding the "sheep" at the Christmas program. Please pray that the children do well as they share the story of Jesus' birth with our congregation.

Liz & Annie finished putting together 27 Christmas gift bags for children in the hospital on Christmas Day. Please be praying for the children and families that will be receiving them Christmas morning.
