Dear Pastor Lowther & Saints of Camp Springs Community Church

Give praise to the Lord; HE indeed is so good to us in so many ways; He has gotten us through the very cold past winter months and now we are appreciating a warm spring season. We have had two tornado warnings in Murfreesboro, TN thus far this spring; we sit and pray in our bedroom closet when the tornado sirens start sounding. We are pleased to share that the church and school ministry which we left in Australia, continues having an impact in the lives of many people and we praise the Lord for that good news. You greatly encourage us with your kindness, care and help; we thank you so much for your prayers and/or financial support which continues to be needed for at least a few more months while we are still getting resettled. We presently need continued prayer for ourselves because we are so fatigued dealing with the long process of still setting into Tennessee; our age and other factors has made it more difficult than we had expected: God is our strength to carry us through each day. PTL!

We finally have moved into our "renovated parsonage'. It has been a long journey which began last July when we signed the contract to renovate our older house (a 5-month 'finish' promise by the contractor has taken nearly 9 months to completion) and there still are needed rectifications to be done by the contractor due to his mistakes. Honestly, a house renovation is not something we ever want to 'go through' again; the stress, frustrations, time requirements, work and headaches have been overwhelming much of the time; this is because our contractor did not properly supervise the work being done. A few weeks ago, we finally had our Australian household goods delivered to our house. There are many boxes to open; this is taking considerable time because the special packing material is thick and cumbersome (very hard to cut) and takes time to unwrap, set-up and organize. Now that the renovation is near the end, we soon will purchase furniture for our house. It is a blessing from God to be in our own house and we are so grateful to HIM. We at times have wondered why we have had to endure such difficulties with many long delays in this resettlement process; however: we keep reminding ourselves that God has a purpose in all of this so we simply must keep trusting Him. —

Ron continues having considerable pain with his sciatica; he has been getting medical treatments for this while he hopefully awaits to get an MRI (via Medicare) to determine what is the root cause of the leg pain; until this problem is resolved, it is not possible for us to travel at the present time. Angie also is trying to manage physical back pain while unpacking boxes; this relocation has not been easy for her because she greatly misses her sisters and the many church friends we left back in Australia. We thank you for all you have done for us, and we praise the Lord for your faithfulness. We pray that God will bless you and reward you eternally for all you have done for Him, our ministry and for us.
