It made life a little difficult to do ministry and start the Stellenbosch roof project. We're relieved to see the sun this week and on Monday the roof project began. They went in and took everything out of the existing building, built a platform, tore off the old roof, transported the trusses today with the bakkie. Next they will be putting the trusses on and then hopefully, the steel before more rain arrives this weekend. Please be praying for safety for our team and closing up the building soon.

Craig had two surgeries this past week. One was to remove an abscess under his arm (very painful) and the other was to have his teeth cleaned and checked over. Thankfully, everything went well and there were no real problems. Thank you for praying! We're also thankful for good medical care here in South Africa.

Speaking of two... we had two robberies. Two weeks ago, skolies (thieves) climbed in over our neighbor's fence and stole half of Wayne's tools and other things. Last week, I had my backpack stolen out of my vehicle and it contained important documents, my laptop and client bank cards. These things shake us up and cause great loss to us in ministry. We always need to be alert and vigilant.

Our teen weekend went well. There were 15 teens and 5 counselors. We taught on life lessons from William Carey, Missionary to Indla. One thing that stuck out was that when he had difficulties he would say they were reasons to trust God more. Such a challenge to all of us!
