One highlight of the restful part of our summer was celebrating the 70th wedding anniversary of Kevin's parents with most of the extended family together. What a joy to recall God's faithfulness over the years and to reconnect in a wonderful setting.

he seeing-eye dog adventure began anew in October with the arrival of Uxley. The downside of having a "baby" in the house is offset by the connections with people that happen because of the puppy. For example, a neighbor said raising a seeing-eye puppy was a noble job. When Kevin said his real job was to be a pastor, it led to an interesting discussion about religion, faith and God. We have invited neighbors from up the street to discover Thanksgiving with us this year – we met them through dog walks and chatting together.

We have the joy of working with an intern from California for 3 months. **Madeleine** is a nurse who loves France, speaks French well already, and is seeking God's direction as to whether He wants her to come minister in France. We'd appreciate prayer for effective partnership and mentorship with her during this time.

The women's seminar: We are thankful for the 100+ women who came to our annual ladies' meeting. Good prep team, good teaching on hope and joy from Psalm 42-43 and Psalm 16, good food and good fellowship. A good day all-around! The event was held at the restaurant we rent on Sunday mornings and we rejoice at the good collaboration we enjoy.

One highlight this Fall was our annual church retreat, this year with another like-minded "sister" church near us. We've been praying together about partnering in ministry and so this retreat was a time to get to know one another better. We have decided to work together on several evangelistic events this Fall. We'd appreciate your prayers as we seek God's direction together for what He has in store for His church here in this corner of France.

Another highlight was a week-long conference for our mission folks serving here in Europe. It was a stretching time of teaching and interaction, but also a wonderful time of sharing and seeing co-workers we basically only see at this event. We enjoyed seeing our first snowfall – 10-12 inches! – while staying inside most of the time 😊. We discovered that co-workers in Germany had published an Advent book and had it translated into French. What a joy to see others' gifts being used for the good of God's work – including here in Corbas! We'll be using it this year at our November 26th Christmas outreach.

November 26th is our Creative Project outreach where people come to make a Christmas ornament or decoration. This year one option will be making an Advent calendar, and our Gospel content will be that the Advent season is a time of anticipation of a GREAT person – Jesus! Several have already signed up which is encouraging.

December 16th we'll be helping our sister church with their stand at the Christmas market in their town (about 15 minutes from ours). They have done this for years as a way of meeting people and sharing the good news of Christ's coming.

December 17th the sister church will join us in the morning for our Christmas worship service and then in the evening partner with us in the English Carol Sing outreach. Many people come due to their interest in the English language, but it is a wonderful opportunity to sing and share of the good news which will bring great joy to all people.

December 24th we'll enjoy a Christmas brunch and worship service with the possibility of inviting friends to attend with us. A group of believers originally from Futuna, part of an island group located in the South Pacific Ocean, are invited to join us so there may be some interesting flavors at our brunch.

Please pray for us to effectively prepare, for invitations to be accepted, for the events to allow much interaction and spark spiritual conversations.

This is a wonderful time of year to be thankful and to share the Good News. We are thankful for God's faithfulness, and your faithfulness, as we bring God's love to life in our neighborhood and in our area. May God richly bless your efforts where you are to reach out to others who don't yet know the Savior born in Bethlehem, who is Christ the Lord.
